

Sunflowers are still Yellow at Night

Block C and piecing.

From the remaining fuchsia/pink fabric cut 18 4.5 x 4.5 Inch squares

From then green fabric cut 36 3 x 3 inch squares

Mark a line diagonally on the reverse side of all 36 green squares

Pin a green square to one corner of each of the 36 Pink and Purple squares (Figure A)

Sew along the drawn lines then trim a $\frac{1}{4}$ inch out from the sewn line. (Figure B)

Press the seams on the purple units towards the purple fabric and press the seams on the pink units towards the green fabric. (Figure C) Arrange as pictured in figure D.

Sew into units of two then four the finished block should look like figure E on the reverse side.

Finished Block C

Make a total of nine of block C.

Lay all blocks out in rows as pictured. You will have four of row A and three of row B.



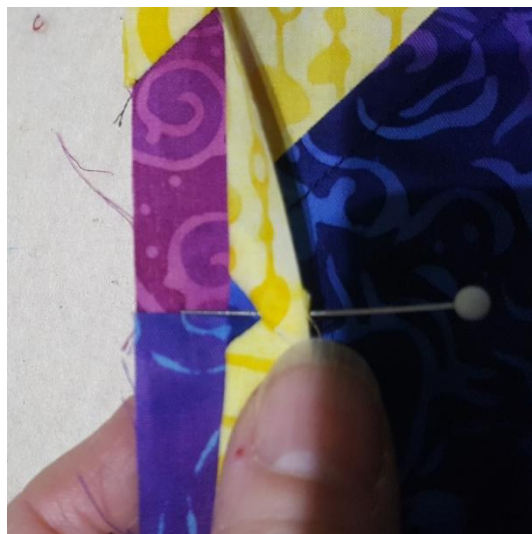
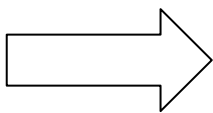
Row A



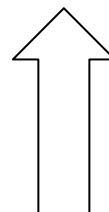
Row B

Tip: Take care at this stage to make sure no blocks are rotated, purple fabric on blocks A and C is in the top left **corner**.

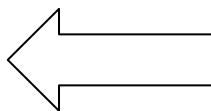
Sew Blocks together as they were
layed out taking care again to not
rotate blocks. Matching centers in
Row A.



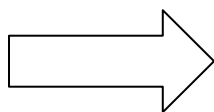
Press all seams in both rows towards the Block A's in the rows.



Sew rows together as pictured this time
matching centers and nesting corners.



Sew rows sets together into
a set of four and three rows.
Sew the last seam together.





Press your quilt with row seams towards A rows. Your quilt body is now finished.
